

## POD Community Session Four Discussion Questions “Mind Renewal (Solomon’s Temple)”

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Module A discussion questions:

1Cor 2:16 tells us that if we are “born again,” we have the Mind of Christ. Why then, do we continue to depend upon our own thinking and not God’s?

What does a transformed life personally mean to you? Do you see your own life being transformed? In what ways?

In your own words describe what mind renewal is. What two things are involved? (Eph 4:22-24; Mt. 16:24; Col 1:27)

Describe the difference between single-mindedness and double-mindedness.

What key points in this session stood out to you or affected your life the most?

Why is it so easy for Satan to get us to disobey God’s Word? (2 Cor. 10:5-6)

What are the three tactics Satan uses to keep us double-minded? Explain each. (Gen. 3:1-7)

In your own words, what is the Mind of Christ? Can you define it scripturally? (Isa 11:1-2)

What is the main purpose of the mind of Christ? (1Cor 2:12-16)

In our own words what does it mean to be an “overcomer”? (1 John 5:4)

Why is our free choice the critical crossroads of our lives? (Rom. 6:6-7, 13; 7:25)

**Module B discussion questions:**

**Why do we compare the architecture of man to the Temple of Solomon? What connection do they have with each other?**

**What part of man is the center core of his being and the base upon which everything else will be built? Why?**

**What are the two parts of our will power? What does each part do? Page 4B.**

**From memory, can you draw what we look like, as the temple of God, when we make “faith choices” and are single-minded? (See Chart 12)**

**Why is it important to ask God to reveal the hidden root causes of our negative thoughts and emotions? Page 8B.**

**Why is it important to put the truth of God’s word back into our hidden chambers after He has freed us from stronghold’s hidden there? (Luke 11:24-25)**

**Module C discussion questions:**

**What do the features and furnishings of the Temple represent?**

**God tells us in 1 John 5:8 that there are three cleansing agents at work in our souls. What are they and what do they do for us? Correlate these to the three pieces of furniture in the Inner Court. Page 3 and 4 C.**

**From Session three we discussed the three P's (tenses: past, present, and future) of salvation. What area of the temple architecture represents each "P"? (See Chart 11)**

**Why is it important to recognize the negative thoughts and emotions that we are experiencing? Wouldn't it just be simpler to vent these things or bury them? Why? Why not?**

**Explain why our offerings are acceptable to God, once we have gone through the Inner Court Rituals and have been cleansed. Why not before? (Malachi 3:3; Psalm 4:5)**
